IN MEMORIAM:

Mr. Francis Charles Peecock.

On Sunday, May 2nd, 1920, after a brief illness, Mr. Francis Charles Peecock passed away at Stowmarket, much regretted by a wide circle of friends. He was head of the firm of Gudgeons, Peecock, and Prentice, solicitors, and was well-known throughout Suffolk, also being registrar of the Stowmarket County Court.

The local Choral Society found in Mr. Peecock a keen supporter, and he officiated as organist at the parish Church. He was initiated a Freemason in 1893, and appointed F.G. Reg. in the province of Suffolk in 1899. Mr. Peecock married a daughter of the late Mrs. Prentice, of Stowmarket.

DEPUTY-SURGEON GENERAL W. A. SMITH-WYNNE.

The death of Deputy-Surgeon General William Smith-Wynne, late of the Indian Army, on July 1st, 1920, in his 86th year, deprives our Society of a useful working member.

He was son of Fred Parsons Smith, and Jane, daughter of T. W. Williams, Barrister of the Inner Temple, and his great grandfather was the Rev. William Wynne, Rector of Dennington, Suffolk. The Wynnes are of a Norfolk family living at Upton near Acle, in 1467. In 1867 he married Jannet Murray, second daughter of Major General John Murray Macgregor, late 6th Madras Cavalry, who with her infant son died at Madras in 1868.

His second wife was Charlotte Sutton, eldest daughter of the late Commander Charles Shaw, R.N., of Norwich, who died at St. Olaves, 1894, and had issue two sons (one now deceased) and one daughter, Constance Olave (wife of Rev. W. E. S. Cooper, Rector of Gissing, Norfolk).

The funeral took place at Herringfleet, where he was Churchwarden more than 40 years, having retired in 1877.

He was an enthusiastic yachtsman, and formerly Rear Commodore of the Royal Norfolk and Suffolk Yacht Club, and as an archæologist compiled and published a book n St. Olaves Priory, and wrote various papers on the Parish of Herringfleet, at present unpublished.
