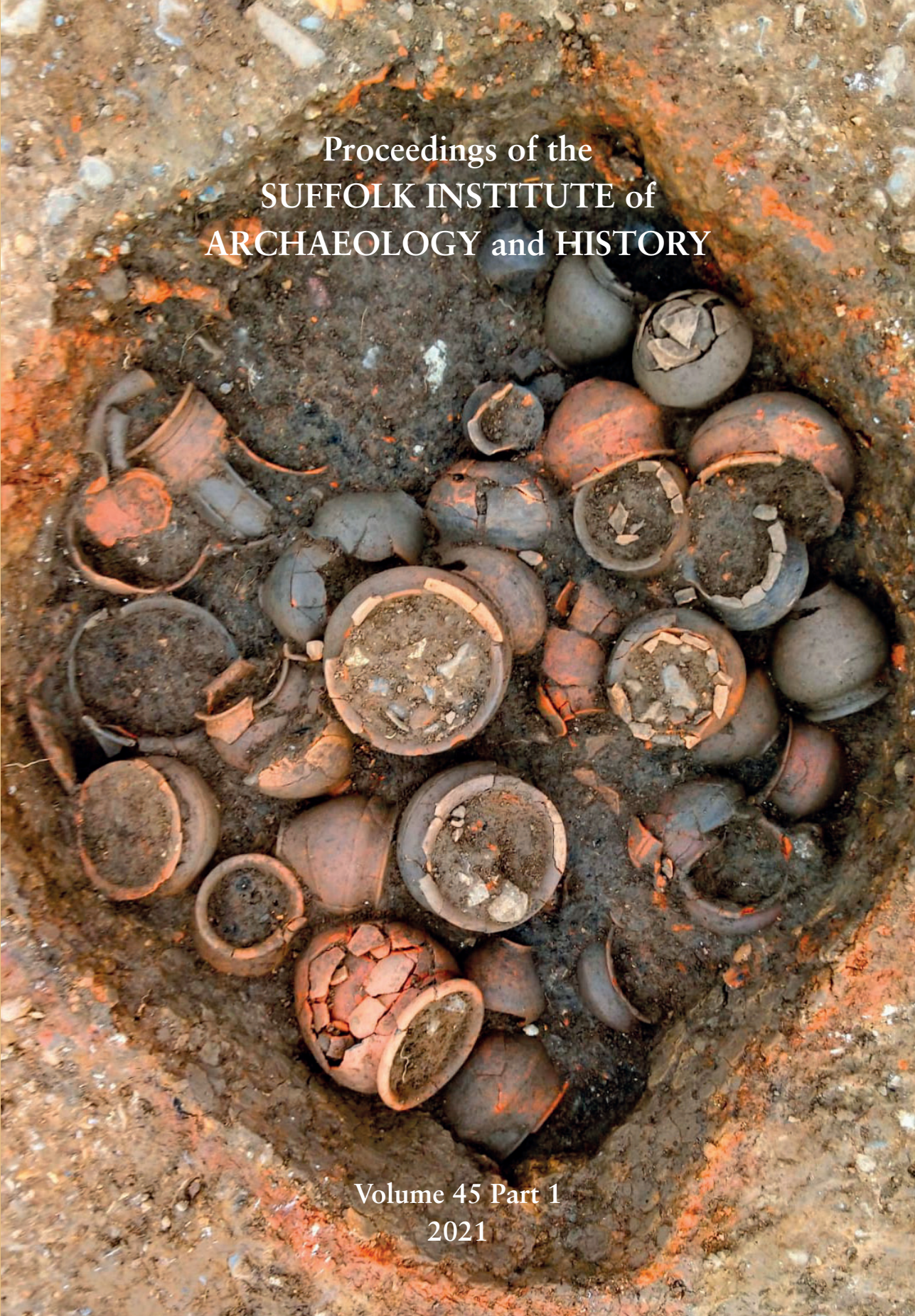

### Subscriptions

The annual subscription, which is due in advance on 1 January, is £25 for an ordinary member; £30 for two adults plus children under 16 at the same address. Members under 25 pay £17. UK institutions pay £35 a year; overseas institutions £40. Subscriptions should be sent to the Lavenham Group (see above), cheques payable to SIAH.

### Privileges

The annual subscription entitles members to a copy of the Institute's journal, the *Proceedings*, which contains articles by national and local scholars on the archaeology and history of Suffolk. They also receive the twice-yearly *Newsletter*, giving details of forthcoming events, short notes and book reviews. The Institute organises a number of excursions in the summer to places of interest in and around Suffolk. In the winter it has a programme of lectures, held at Elmswell. Members may also use and borrow books from the Institute's library, housed in the Suffolk Archives, Raingate Street, Bury St Edmunds. Finally, members who wish to take an active part in archaeological fieldwork may join the Institute's Field Group, which has close links with the County Archaeological Service and local museums.
